## Size of Fish Stocked

Most of the fish stocked in the District's lakes are young of the year and come from the IDNR Hatcheries. These fish range in size from 2 to 3 inches for bass and bluegill. Hybrid sunfish for the IDNR's Urban Fishing Program are 6 to 8 inches.

Channel catfish are stocked at around 6 inches in all of the District's lakes

Northern pike are stocked in the 6 to 8 inch range and muskellunge range from 10 to 12 inches when stocked.

Walleye fingerlings from the IDNR are 2 to 3 inches and the walleye for Tampier are ether fingerlings and/or fry.

Rainbow trout are stocked in the ½ to ¾ pound range.

The 59,366 largemouth bass were stocked at 2 to 3 inches. These fish went into Busse-Main and Skokie Lagoons which host the Illinois High School Bass Tournament.

Due to limited supplies at the State hatchery no musky were stocked in Busse-Main this year.
