

As the temperatures drop, a different kind of adventure awaits in the Forest Preserves of Cook County. Winter camping offers a chance to enjoy the great outdoors in a way that many overlook, proving that it is not just a summer activity. While the idea of camping in colder weather may seem intimidating, Forest Preserves Camping Program Coordinator Brian Arnoldt says that with the right preparation, it can be just as enjoyable as in any other season.

"The main thing for winter camping, and it doesn't matter if you're spending the day outside or a month outside, is layering," said Arnoldt. "You need to layer your clothes."

Starting with a moisture-wicking base layer is crucial.

"People think they're going to be cold while they're outdoors doing

things in the winter, but they're going to sweat faster than they would in the fall or early spring with layers on," Arnoldt explained. "The layers aren't to keep the cold out, they're to keep the warmth in."

When it comes to sleeping, proper insulation is key. Arnoldt recommends using multiple ground pads to prevent heat loss and investing in a sleeping bag with the appropriate lab-tested temperature rating. Also, using a sleeping bag liner will help add 5 to 15 degrees of warmth while wicking away nighttime sweat.

To start the day on a warm note, Arnoldt suggests a simple yet effective trick: "Put base layer garments in the sleeping bag at night. When you wake up, you'll have toasty warm clothes to wear." Staying hydrated is another essential aspect often overlooked



in colder climates. "Dehydration is actually a big factor in the winter," said Arnoldt. "Because you're cold, you don't think about dehydration. Often the air is dryer in the winter, sucking the moisture right out of your body."

Arnoldt says packing plenty of extra garments is a must do and managing moisture inside of the equally as important.

"Do you want to go sledding for three hours and then have nothing to change into? Probably not," Arnoldt said. "Think about when you're going to sled, how you're going to sled, and make sure you bring lots of extra clothes, boots, hats and gloves.

Another tip to enjoy the evening: Before settling in, knock off any snow from boots to keep the interior dry. "Treat winter camping like every other camping trip, but be a little smarter about it," advised Arnoldt. Most Forest Preserves campgrounds welcome visitors during the colder months; many offer heated cabins for those who prefer a little added coziness and comfort.





TAKES ON THE
WINTER ELEMENTS

Winters in Cook County can be brutal and for the wildlife in the Forest Preserves, it takes some work to ensure survival until the spring.

While some of the Forest Preserves' mammals do hibernate through the winter, the 70,000 acres of land is home to an abundance of wildlife, including mammals, herpes and fish, which adapt to the snow and low temperatures differently.

Here are some examples of local wildlife and their tricks of survival during fridgid Cook County winters:



DID YOU KNOW?

Brumation, like hibernation in mammals, is a period of reduced activity for herptiles during winter or extended periods of low temperatures.

HERPTILE: **Spring Peeper** (Pseudacris crucifer)

SURVIVAL STRATEGY:

Hiding and freeze prevention **DETAILS:** Spring Peepers rely on
existing spaces in logs for shelter.
The frogs have evolved to help
prevent parts of their bodies
from freezing including their liver
releasing more glucose.

HERPTILE: Snapping Turtle (Chelydra serpentina)

SURVIVAL STRATEGY:

Brumation underwater

DETAILS: Snapping Turtles go
into brumation. They brumate in
lakes and ponds because water
underneath ice is above freezing,
often warmer than on land.

FISH: Bluegill

(Lepomis macrochirus)

SURVIVAL STRATEGY: Fatten up and slow down

DETAILS: They fatten up throughout fall after recognizing reduction in daylight. By late fall/early winter, they eat less food, go into a torpor state and "sit" or slowly swim in the deeper areas.

HERPTILE: Common Garter Snake (Thamnophis sirtalis)

SURVIVAL STRATEGY:

Brumation underground

DETAILS: These herpitiles rely on
heat from the environment by going
underground, using holes that
already exist.

MAMMAL: Thirteen-Lined Ground Squirrel

(Ictidomys tridecemlineatus)

SURVIVAL STRATEGY: Hibernatiion DETAILS: Thirteen-Lined Ground Squirrels eat large quantities of food during spring/summer to build up stores of brown fat, and they go underground in burrows below the frost line to hibernate.

MAMMAL: North American Beaver (Castor canadensis)

SURVIVAL STRATEGY: Store food and spend time in their lodges.

DETAILS: Beavers stash twigs, branches and pieces of sapling trees in the mud underwater. They spend more time inside their lodge to stay warm, rest and mate.


