



EDUCATION FIELD TRIP DAILY ACCESS PERMIT OVERVIEW

An Education Access Permit is required for all school/educational activities, such as field trips to a Preserve or Nature Center, for all groups of 25 or more, and/or when requested from Forest Preserve staff. The Permit is granted for the day of the field trip or activity. There is no fee for the one (1) day Education Access Permit.

Submittal Requirements:

To apply for the Education Access Permit please submit the following:

1. Completion of the Education Access Permit Application.
2. Attachment A: Consisting of a letter on the organizations official letterhead requesting the permit, including:
(a) A detailed description of the purpose of visit; (b) Location(s) of field trip; and, (c) List of all attendees.
3. Attachment B: Consisting of required Insurance and/or Individual Waivers (i.e. permission slips if participants are under 18 years of age).
4. **Please Note:**
 - a. All activities must take place during normal hours of operation unless otherwise approved by the Forest Preserves.
 - b. Applications should be received no later than ten (10) days in advance for review.
 - c. Cancellations: Cancellations with short notices cause significant scheduling difficulties for Forest Preserves staff and volunteers. Please give the Forest Preserves at least 24 hours' notice if there is a Field Trip will be canceled.
 - d. Adult Supervision: Teachers and chaperones are responsible for monitoring the conduct of students, participants, and volunteers.
 - e. Special Needs: Please inform the Forest Preserves if there are individuals with special needs a part of the field trip in order to ensure proper access and location designations are discussed and/or arranged.
 - f. Group Size: To ensure quality of programs and safety, the Forest Preserves can effectively handle a maximum of 100 students per field trip.
 - g. Medical Release Form: Teachers and group supervisors are encouraged to carry emergency contact numbers and signed medical waiver for each child under 18 years old, allowing the teacher to give permission for medical treatment.
